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ANNEX I SELECTION PROCESS

POST 1: TECHNICAL MANAGER SEA-EU (Research and Teaching Support Graduate)

PROFILE: person with extensive experience in planning and managing European projects, preferably from the Erasmus+ programme, with training in the drafting of technical and financial reports, with digital skills, as well as leadership, teamwork, communication and decision-making abilities.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE POST:

- Carrying out coordination and dynamization tasks of the SEA-EU technical working group.
- Supporting the executive committee and the thematic subcommittees of the "European University of the Seas" alliance in the administrative, technical and financial management of the project.
- Drafting reports, preparing meetings and coordination tasks with other members of the "European University of the Seas" alliance, as well as the respective technicians of the various administrative units of the University of Cadiz

EXAM PHASE:

<u>1. First exercise</u>, of a technical nature, will consist of answering a maximum of 10 questions, which will assess the applicants' knowledge of the subjects and responsibilities of the post being offered, included in this Annex. The maximum score to be obtained in this first exercise will be 20 points, with a minimum of 10 points being required to pass.

<u>2. Second exercise</u>, of a practical nature, will consist of an oral/interview test that will cover the elements assessed in the education and past experience phase, the syllabus outlined in Annex II and the applicants' curriculum, in order to assess the capacity, skills and technical know-how required to carry out the job. The maximum score to be obtained in this second exercise will be 40 points, with a minimum of 20 points being required to pass.

The exercises in this exam phase may be carried out in either Spanish or English or alternating between both languages.

- Accreditation B1 or above in other languages of the SEA-EU alliance: German, Croatian, French or Polish. Up to 5 points.
- Excellence in oral and written expression in English and Spanish. Up to 5 points.



POST 2: LOCAL MANAGER SEA-EU (Research and Teaching Support Graduate).

<u>PROFILE</u>: person with experience in the administrative, technical and economic management of international projects, as well as in the management of dissemination and communication resources of European or international projects.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE POST:

- Tasks related to the management and dissemination of UCA activities in the context of the "European University of the Seas" alliance.
- Support in the administrative, technical and financial management of the project at the UCA level.
- Preparation of texts and reports in English and Spanish.
- Image and social network support (community manager).
- Coordination of the communication team.

EXAM PHASE:

<u>1. First exercise</u>, of a technical nature, will consist of answering a maximum of 10 questions, which will assess the applicants' knowledge of the subjects and responsibilities of the post being offered, included in this Annex. The maximum score to be obtained in this first exercise will be 20 points, with a minimum of 10 points being required to pass.

<u>2.
