Dear Rectors and other esteemed colleagues,

The Governing Board meeting taking place in Malta on 28 November 2024 will coincide with the end of the period during which I had the honour and privilige of carrying the title "Rector of SEA-EU".

Malta, for the second time a meeting venue for SEA-EU, will be welcoming the other eight universities to our campus and their staff will participate in discussions and decisions that need to be taken to move the Alliance forwards. We have a packed agenda for the Governing Board meeting, which we have stretched into the afternoon, a first for SEA-EU.

We will have a day-long informal meeting for Rectors on Wednesday which I hope to be useful. It's a common adage that time flies and, truth be told, we are already in the third year of this second SEA-EU Alliance. We are gathered here in Malta, within one of the oldest University campuses in the world, to take stock of what has been achieved so far and to plot the course ahead of us, motivated by the searing desire to bring to fruition the various programmes and initiatives that have been conceived by our academics, administrators and students. Malta's ambition has always far outstripped its territorial extent.

For instance, the EU's smallest EU member state and a member of the Commonwealth, was instrumental in the formulation of the UNCLOS (United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea) in 1982, was actually was the first country to formally table the issue of climate change as a political agenda to the United Nations General Assembly in 1988, hosted a historic George Bush-Mikhail Gorbachev summit in 1989 just a few weeks after the fall of the Berlin Wall and is currently occupying a rotating seat on the UN Security Council. The fact that tiny Malta manages to punch so significantly above its weight can serve to inspire and to motivate us all to aim ever higher within our Alliance.

Numerous visionaries and luminaries have, over the passage of time, commented on the importance of collaboration and cooperation. For instance, Sir Isaac Newton is attributed with 'If I have seen further, it is by standing on the shoulder of giants', whilst the insightful 'It is the long history of humankind (and animal kind, too) that those who learned to collaborate and improvise most effectively have prevailed' has been attributed to none other than Charles Darwin.

In agricultural societies dominated by the cultivation of corn, such as the US and Canada, the month of November is synonymous with harvest time and we have indeed reached the juncture within the Alliance where we start concretising on the key deliverables which had been pledged at proposal stage. Malta welcomes you all and solicits the implementation of the bold steps necessary to ensure the future legacy of our Alliance.

And let's not forget that a governing week is also celebration of the successes achieved over the past six months, thanks to the dedicated efforts of our entire university community, especially the expert groups who have been working diligently on various tasks.

SDG14 Beyond 2030: Charting a course for sustainable coastal and marine ecosystems (workshop)

Workshop description:

There is an intrinsic relation between the sustainable use of ocean resources for economic growth, jobs and social and financial inclusion, and the preservation and restoration of ocean ecosystems and the services they provide (UNDP, 2023). Several new initiatives could potentially lead towards a sustainable development of the coastal and marine ecosystems. However, decision-makers need to address the multiple social, ecological, and technological dimensions from managing the coastal and marine areas and need to make choices about potential opportunities and how to resolve tensions or conflicts to develop a long-term future vision for sustainability. This is a hands-on workshop where we will explore three future pathways related to the development of marine renewable energy, nature-based solutions and ecosystem services, and the actions and trade-offs needed to work towards achieving SDG14.

He has also consulted on environmental and other scientific matters to the Government of Malta, local firms and industrial concerns.

Frank Bezzina Pro-Rector for International Development and Quality Assurance

Professor Frank Bezzina is the Pro-Rector for International Development and Quality Assurance at the University of Malta. He is currently the European University of the Seas (SEA-EU) Vice-Rector for Quality. He lectures in Management Science, Applied Business Statistics and Evidence-based Management.
