

Informed consent:

In accordance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, by accepting to fill this questionnaire, you give your consent for your answers to be stored for data collection and treatment purposes (only summarized aggregated results will be published; no individual answers will be published). All responses are anonymized, and all personal data will be deleted within 90 days after the research by the project ends. Results of this research will be published. All interested participants will be informed of the outcomes of the research. The research results will be also published on the project website <https://sea-eu.org/sea-eu-doc/>. Giving your consent in taking part in this survey, you give consent to the details described above.

You have the right to revoke your consent within 90 days after the research by the project ends, without specifying reasons for doing so. This revocation only affects the future, i.e. processing up to the date of revocation remains valid. **Contact for revoke: XXXE-Mail-Address.** In addition to the above-mentioned right to revoke your consent, you also have a right to:

- **information** about your personal data stored with us;
- **correction** of any incorrect data stored;
- **deletion** of any data we have about you which is no longer needed;
- **restrictions** on the processing of your data, subject to certain conditions.
This may be the case, for example, if deletion is not possible, but the data may no longer be processed.
- **transferability** of your data.
This right applies in particular if you have given your consent to the processing of your data, or if processing of the data is necessary in order to fulfil a contract. The right to data transferability does not exist, insofar as your data is processed during fulfilment of the university's statutory tasks.
- make a **complaint** to a supervisory authority.

We would like to draw your attention to the fact that in certain cases we may require additional information from you in order to determine your identity. In this way we can, for example, ensure that information is not released to unauthorised persons, under the right to receive information.
