## TOPIC OF THE INTERSHIP

- The maritime history of Algarve, a marginal region of Iberia, but connected by sea routes to the Mediterranean and the Atlantic North since the 10th century. For centuries, Algarve stood as a frontier between these two different worlds, allowing and profiting from the circulation of people, knowledge, skills, supplies and commodities. Local and national archival sources are, however, too scarce to fully understand this maritime history's mechanics and the nature and composition of the local communities that supported it. Research on foreign archives (Spain, Italy, France, England, Holland, and Germany), as well as a taste for comparative and global history, are thus necessary to uncover it.
