ABOUT THE ABSTRACTS

Extended abstract submission: Authors should submit an extended abstract with contact details listed and centralised at the top of the page (name, surname, university, contact). After that, the title of the paper should be placed and centralised, followed by 400-500 words and 3-5 keywords. Abstract submission implies the intent of at least one of the authors to register and present the paper if accepted. All abstracts are supposed to be written in *Times New Roman* and font 11.
