The program is open to undergraduates, masters, and Ph.D. students from all fields of study related to sustainable development, with priority given to students of SEA-EU member universities.
	Course Components: The program consists of three courses:
	Making City Sustainable: A 15-hour course with 6 online lectures and 9 hours of contact and study visits. Coordinator: Dr hab. Marcin Wołek, prof. UG (marcin.wolek@ug.edu.pl). Topics include sustainable cities in strategic context, economic and social conflicts, urban transformations, and mobility planning.
	Happy Means Green: A 15-hour course involving 6 online lectures and 9 hours of contact and study visits. Coordinator: Dr inż. Aleksanda Koszarek-Cyra (Aleksandra.koszarek-cyra@ug.edu.pl). The course covers natural capital, ecosystem services, urban greening, and the benefits of green spaces.
	Sustainable Investing in Happy City: A 15-hour course with 6 online lectures and 9 hours of contact and study visits. Coordinator: Dr hab. Anna Wojewnik-Filipkowska, prof. UG (anna.filipkowska@ug.edu.pl). This course addresses challenges for cities, the role of investment in city development, the concept of a happy city, and partnership in city development.
