# **Day 2 – 12<sup>th</sup> November 2025**

#### 10:00 - User Experience and Reconfiguration of Library Spaces

This session focuses on how academic libraries are providing user-centred services which cater for students and researchers emerging needs and expectations, offering personalised assistance, resources and technologies. Additionally, the session highlights the importance of reconfiguring study spaces to offer a blend of silent and group-work study areas which improve user experience and promote an environment which is conducive to innovation and creativity, and which stimulates teaching, learning, study and research, both individually and collaboratively.

### 10:30 - Redefining Access: How Digital Transformation is Reshaping **Academic Libraries**

Digital transformation is reshaping academic libraries by improving access to resources, enabling remote services and enhancing user experience. This session explores the digital transformation of academic libraries, emphasising the transition from print to digital formats through digital libraries and institutional repositories. It highlights the integration of advanced technologies such as AI, machine learning, and data analytics to improve user experience and management of electronic resources.

#### 11:00 - Coffee Break

### 11:30 – Academic Libraries: Their Role in Showcasing and Preserving National Culture, Heritage and Identity

This session highlights the crucial role academic libraries play in showcasing and preserving national culture, heritage and identity. It covers digital preservation strategies that ensure long-term access to scholarly works, focusing on the challenges and solutions for maintaining digital content. The session also explores efforts to preserve prestigious and historical collections, many of which are being digitised.

#### 12:00 – The Transparent and Open Science Game

An interactive session which focuses on the principles of Open Science, including Open Access, Open Data, collaboration and reproducibility. Participants will engage in real-world scenarios, learning to navigate ethical challenges and promote transparency, fostering a culture of collaboration and innovation in scientific research.

This presentation explores how libraries empower researchers by promoting Open Access to research publications, supporting Research Data Management, fostering collaboration, ensuring transparency and promoting knowledge-sharing. It also discusses strategic initiatives, challenges and the future of libraries in shaping the Open Science landscape.
