It is a special edition with panel lessons of summer school. Apart from bringing together researchers in the area of graph theory and combinatorics, this edition will be broadened by a few extraordinary events with young scientists, PhD students, and even students in mind. A series of tutorials concerning the latest aspects of algorithmic graph theory are planned.
