Learning outcomes	After completing this course, students should be able <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know about the pollution of ships with special regard to ship, and to document the socio-legal approach on the plastic pollution in ocean To know and apply the participatory principle in Environmental Law at European level
Course contents	The morning session is a theoretical session, with two lessons given respectively by Split (Maritime Law and pollution) and Brest (socio-legal approach on plastic pollution). The afternoon session is given by Brest and invite student to empower themselves to propose a European Citizen Initiative to the European Commission, regarding their interest and wishes on environmental matter. <u>REMARK</u> : The two courses (morning and afternoon) can be followed independently
Prerequisites and/or recommended academic background	No. The students can attend the course without any previous knowledge in the subject. The registration is mandatory to enable a good organization in the constitutions of groups. The exercise (in the afternoon) is done during the course and does not require to read, download any document before the course.
Assessment	There is no examination. The objective is to freely enrich its own knowledge and work with other students from other SEA-EU university, asking questions and discussing.
