Abstract: (few lines describing the course that SEA-EU partners can use for dissemination)	This Blended Intensive Program invites students from SEA-EU universities to improve their English while engaging in a unique intercultural and creative experience. Over the course of five days, participants will explore the links between language, gender and creativity through the practice of textile arts such as knitting and crochet. Working in multicultural teams, they will share personal and cultural stories, learn new skills, and co-create a collective textile artwork that symbolises the connections between our universities. The program combines hands-on workshops, intercultural dialogue and reflective writing, leading to a final project connected to the RESSAC Festival March 2026 in Brest, (on one of the themes: "Glories and Misfortunes of the Vagina").

Day 2 – Storytelling: Personal and cultural narratives expressed through textiles; short written/oral productions in English, starting a maker's diary, cultural visit. Day 3 – Collaboration: Design of a collective artwork, teamwork across cultures, project planning and start of collective creation. Day 4 – Reflection & Creativity: Continuation of the artwork, reflective writing, preparation for final presentations.
