Abstract: (briefly describe the staff week to allow SEA-EU partners to disseminate effectively)	<p>The STORM staff week aims to evaluate the programme's first year and to best prepare for the upcoming academic year. Key objectives are to harmonise pedagogical content and teaching practices, finalising semester 4 guidelines (internships/dissertations), clarify mobility/visa protocols for non-EU students with the international offices of partner universities, and optimise the use of shared resources.</p> <p>This staff week will bring together administrative and academic staff will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Common sessions: shared between both administrative and academic staff. They will focus on evaluation based on the first cohort's feedback, and the optimisation of the overall coordination. - Thematic workshops: These will allow in-depth discussions. The academic team will work on harmonising pedagogical content, assessment methods, finalising semester 4 guidelines, etc, while the administrative team will focus on the operational reality, day-to-day management and global coordination. <p>By the end of the staff week, we expect to come out with improved protocols and a clear shared vision, allowing a smooth progression of the STORM programme for future cohorts.</p>
